Nationalist backbenchers who
will this week be appointed to
the role of Parliamentary Private
Secretaries (PPS) are to be bound

by a Code of Ethics that will pre-
clude them from retaining their
position, should they vote against
the government.

A Ministerial Code review –
based on the UK House of Com-
mons' model – is currently under

way to accommodate the inclu-
sion of PPS's in the revised work-
ings of the Government bench.

MaltaToday is informed that
the responsibilities and restric-
tions incumbent on a PPS will
include the following passage:

"Parliamentary Private Secretar-
ies are expected to support the
government in important divi-
sions in the House. No PPS who
votes against Government can
retain his or her position."
